Calling all Block Captains

PPNA is looking for volunteers to serve as **BLOCK CAPTAINS**. This job will entail getting to know your neighbors, communicating news from the Board, and gathering information that would allow us to contact them in case of emergency in close proximity to their home. Information provided is at each resident's discretion and would only be used in their best interest. Common examples are:

- ➡ Your neighbor leaves his house without lowering the garage door.... did they mean to do that.... should I close it for them?
- ➡ Our safety committee chairperson is driving the neighborhood late one night and sees a house with the garage door open. Wouldn't a call from your block captain be appreciated?
- ➡ What looks like your neighbor's dog is wandering the neighborhood. What was the dog's name? Should I call my neighbor to see what he wants me to do?
